Larger Projects

For projects over \$25,000 you may need the following:

- A strategic plan and/or business plan;
- A feasibility study;
- Evidence of national body support;
- Explanation of how your event may become self sustaining.

What We Do Not Generally Fund

- Individuals;
- Commercial organisations;
- Sponsorships;
- Travel to conferences, seminars, reunions, etc;
- Endowments or capital funds;
- Political parties or lobby groups;
- Projects considered to be the responsibility of central or local Government;
- Repayment of debt;
- Retrospective costs;
- Core operational expenses;
- Prizes for sporting events;
- Uniforms for over 18yrs.

The Trust is not a principal funder of projects. It expects that the applicant will raise a significant proportion of the project cost elsewhere.
