For projects over \$25,000 you may need the following:

- A strategic plan and/or business plan;
- A demonstration of how the project fits with national policies;
- Evidence of community consultation;
- Evidence of support of local authorities and relevant Government departments.

What We Do Not Generally Fund

- Individuals;
- Commercial organisations;
- · Sponsorships;
- Travel to conferences, seminars, reunions, etc;
- Endowments or capital funds;
- Political parties or lobby groups;
- Projects considered to be the responsibility of central or local Government;
- · Repayment of debt;
- · Retrospective costs;
- Core operational expenses;
- Rest homes;
- Core operations of district health boards, hospitals and clinics.

The Trust is not a principal funder of projects. It expects that the applicant will raise a significant proportion of the project cost elsewhere.
