Larger Projects

For applications over \$25,000 you may need the following:

- Evidence of community consultation;
- Support and/or consent of local authorities and relevant Government departments;
- A feasibility study;
- A strategic plan and/or a business plan.

What We Do Not Generally Fund

- Projects considered to be the responsibility of central or local Government agencies;
- Core operational expenses including salaries;
- Retrospective projects;
- Repayment of debt;
- Commercial organisations;
- Endowments or capital funds.

The Trust is not a principal funder of projects. It expects that the applicant will raise a significant proportion of the project cost elsewhere.
